We believe that everyone can make a difference. As a community of different beliefs, backgrounds, religious and non-religious worldviews, Habitat brings people together to celebrate our diversity and honor our shared commitment to the common good.





# **Our Impact**

- Since our start in 1986, we have built and rehabbed over 393 homes and completed more than 176 critical home repairs in the Greater Richmond Metro area.
- In fiscal year 2024, we served a total of 52 families through our programs
- Last year, we mobilized 2,194 construction, ReStore and special event volunteers to fill 6.063 spots - a total of 34,061 service hours.
- Our ReStores helped to divert 2.9 million pounds of usable goods from local landfills.
- We save an average of nearly \$60,000 on every home we build with volunteers!

### **HOMEOWNER SPOTLIGHT**

On Tuesday, June 18th, we held the Home Dedication for one of our newest homeowners, Melissa!

Melissa learned about Richmond Metropolitan Habitat for Humanity because her grandmother was a part of the program and she grew up in that Habitat home.

"Owning a home will mean that I am able to give my kids everything they need. I want to say thank you for helping my dream come true."

This house was extra special thanks to our unique partnership with Reveille United Methodist Church who had some big dreams - to build a whole Habitat house and frame it in their backyard! They raised over \$100,000 toward the construction and started framing in the parking lot of their church's Cary Street Road campus. We transported the panels to the final site and completed the home. This marked the first time Richmond Habitat started a panel build off-site. It was quite successful thanks to Reveille's commitment and passion.







# **CONSTRUCTION POSSIBILITIES**

Habitat homes are built by a volunteer workforce. No experience is necessary, just a willing attitude and desire to help! Volunteers are guided by our professional construction staff who teach everything you need to know on the build site. There are a variety of tasks, both indoors and outdoors, in which to participate that can use all levels of skill and ability. To volunteer on a construction site you must be at least 16 years old. Construction projects are Wednesday-Saturday, 8AM-3PM all year.

### Construction at The JXN Project

In September 2024, the Skipwith-Roper Cottage project broke ground at 303 E. Bates Street in Richmond. One part monument, one part innovation hub, the reestablished cottage and community center will honor Abraham Peyton Skipwith. Known as 'The Founding Father of Jackson Ward,' Skipwith became the neighborhood's first Black homeowner in 1793. Richmond Habitat will be involved as a community partner to bring volunteers to the site to help build.

### **Construction at Highland Grove**

In September 2024, RMHFH joined other non-profits and Richmond city leaders to break ground on a new neighborhood on Dove Street that we hope will be a model for increasing the affordable housing stock in the city. Known as Highland Grove, the mixed-income community will include more than 120 single family units, including detached homes, duplexes, and triplexes. Around half will be reserved for first time home buyers.

# FIRE UP FAITH & FELLOWSHIP WITH HABITAT FOR HUMANITY

### RETIREES



Retirees can fellowship with one another by volunteering monthly or weekly at a build site or at one of our ReStore locations. No experience is necessary! Help is especially needed Wednesdays through Fridays.

Seniors often enjoy collecting household items for our 'Welcome Home Baskets' which are given to new homeowners.



# CHILDREN (AGES 5-12)

Youngsters can hold fundraising drives and participate in monthly activities posted on the youth page of our website. They can also take part in events like our Annual Youth LEGO Build.



# **YOUTH** (**AGES 13-18**)



Youth Groups can support our Habitat ReStores by holding a furniture and building materials drive. They also enjoy landscaping projects around our newly-constructed homes.

# **FAMILIES & INDIVIDUALS**

Everyone can pray for those who need safe, decent, permanent housing around the world.

Parents can volunteer with their kids at a ReStore or at a build site (age 16+).

# HOSPITALITY MINISTRIES





# COMMITMENT & PARTICIPATION



Richmond Metropolitan Habitat for Humanity (RMHFH) is grateful to our Faith Partners for joining us in this journey of providing housing and enabling our mission to succeed. # **OUR INTERFAITH EFFORTS**

Every year, mission-minded faith communities in Metro Richmond join in building and rehabbing homes for deserving families, and serving in our ReStores, thereby sharing God's love in our community. All faith groups are welcome! In the first part of 2024, volunteers and contributors from Islamic and Jewish congregations were a part of 40 faith groups who supported Richmond Habitat in multiple ways. All land and property donations are tax-deductible to the full extent allowed by law, and some donations may be eligible for tax credits.
